"As a market-driven developer, our focus is on acquiring prime lands at strategic locations to allow us to plan our residential products to be affordable without compromising the quality and facilities to further enhance the lives of home

buyers," he said at the launch of M Arisa in KL yesterday.

Mah Sing CEO Datuk Ho Hon Sang said the developer has no remaining landbank in Sentul.

"One of the reasons for the success of M Centura is because there is no more land in the area; it is a mature market," he added.

The developer hopes M Arisa could achieve a 90% take-up rate as well. Ho said Mah Sing is always on the lookout for potential landbank in the Klang Valley. The 1.34ha project is targeted mainly for first-time homebuyers and upgraders.

The development is designed to provide residents a contemporary and quality lifestyle with facilities for optimised living experience.

Meanwhile, Ho said Mah Sing is on track to achieve its RM1.56 billion sales for the year.

"We have achieved 50% of the target sales as at the first half of the year," he said, adding that the company is planning to launch several more projects by the end of this year.
